

Sectoral Highlights of 2022



1. Water and Sanitation (WASH):

During the period January 2022 to December 2022 SMKK has been focused on Water and Sanitation related interventions in many parts of Bangladesh with the funding of different donors and Partners.

- Installed 25 Deep Tube-wells and supported for maintenance work.
- Installed 905 Hand Pumps and support for water quality test and maintenance services.
- Constructed 20 Ozukhana supported for work.
- Organized 275 Awareness sessions and created awareness among more than 10000 beneficiaries on using safe water and good hygiene practices.
- Ensured pure drinking water and safe water for batching and house-hold works for 55000 HHs.



2. Education Sector:

One of the most prioritized objectives of SMKK is Education. During the reporting year January 2022 to December 2022, supported to ensure education through its own funds and financial supports from its development partners.

- Ensure Primary and Pre-primary education for 250 Children
- Provided Non-formal education to 750 Children
- Provided basic education for 100 Rohingya Children
- Provided education materials to 100 Children.



Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Response and Humanitarian Sectors:

SMKK's mandates to quick response to any types of disaster occurred in operational areas. During the reporting period January 2022 to December 2022 SMKK mostly concentrated on Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Response, Humanitarian related activities through different projects with the funding and technical supports of various donors and partners.

- Developed 11 Upazila Based Disaster Preparedness Committee (UDPC) and provided orientation to 70 volunteers response against Super Cyclone Amphan.
- Formed 10 Protection Watch Committee and Provided Training on disaster risk reduction issues i.e., land slide, earthquake and cyclone preparedness.
- Formed and Functioned 5 adolescent clubs with boys and girls and provided training to 100 volunteers on disaster preparedness.
- •Provided emergency supports (Health, Wash, protection, solar energy and non-food items distribution) to Costal zone of Bangladesh.



4. Agriculture, Livelihood and Food Security Sector:

During the reporting year January 2022 to December 2022 SMKK's implemented various activities to improve livelihoods and food security for the poor and vulnerable communities with the funding of various donors and partners.

- Supported micro-finance support to 125 poor and vulnerable women to start and re-start Income generating activities i.e., small shop, poultry farming, cow rearing, homestead gardening, fish farming and rickshaw/van pulling and improved their livelihood and ensured food security.
- Supported 75 Poor and Vulnerable women for homestead gardening and field crop cultivation in commercially.
- Provided cow to 45 Vulnerable Women to ensure livelihood security.
- Provided support to 25 small holders for fish farming commercially.
- Provided support to 35 small holders for white fish and shrimp farming commercially.



5. Health and Nutrition Sector:

During the period January 2022 to December 2022 SMKK has been focused on Health and Nutrition related interventions in many parts of Bangladesh with the funding of different donors and Partners.

- Provided free treatment and medicine to about 5600 patients.
- Provided free treatment and counselling to about 6000 poor and vulnerable people under free Friday clinic of SMKK
- Provided 215 ANC and PNC supports to 250 Pregnant women and 75 Lactating mothers.
- Provided support to 350 Lactating mother through social safety-net programs
- Provided Hygiene Kits to 7200 HHs
- Organized 205 Awareness sessions on primary health Care, Nutrition and family planning and created awareness and sensitized more than 10000.



6. Climate Change Adaptation and Environment Sectors:

- Planted and cherished 500 coconut trees
- Planted and cherished 250 ornamental and 500 flowering plants
- Formed and Functioned 5 adolescent clubs with boys and girls and provided training to 100 volunteers on disaster preparedness.
- Developed Horticulture Field and Planted Lawn grass/carpet grass to greenify the about 13000 Sqm areas.

7. Human rights, Women Empowerment, Good Governance, Disability Supports and Gender Development Sector:

As a humanitarian organization SMKK always emphasized on human rights, women empowerment, good governance and Gender development issues in its every single program.



- Provided orientation training to 15 staffs 25 Community Facilitators on human rights, women empowerment, good governance and Gender development issues.
- Ensured women participation in every event/programs
- Established 10 women and child friendly spaces and sensitized on GBV issues
- Prioritized PWDs and WWDs in selection its clients/beneficiaries in the committee or groups
- Distributed assistive devices i.e., walking sticks, wheel chair, hearing device, glasses to the 500 PWDs and WWDs.
- Formed 5 adolescent clubs and 20 Watchdogs with women leadership
- Established 'make-up corner' and providing make-ups materials especially for adolescent girl, female children and women.
- •Provided Training to 200 Adolescent girls on family planning, personal hygiene, child marriage, human trafficking, Girl's education etc.
- Organized/celebrated International Human Rights Day and Women's Day.






During the report year, SMKK organized different Human Resource and skill development training for the beneficiaries to increase their basic awareness, knowledge, behavior, attitude and entrepreneurship. Well-designed training materials (mostly visual) were used for the target recipients and practical sessions were organized for the skill development training. SMKK hired some experienced resource persons from other organization besides its own training personnel. Regular mentoring and extension support and in some cases refresher training was organized for the beneficiaries.

- Provided Entrepreneurship Development Training to 25 Entrepreneurs.
- Provided Training to 20 Community Facilitators on facilitation and psychosocial treatments.
- Provided training to 10 staffs community mobilization, monitoring and Evaluation.
- Provided Training to 20 staffs on Gender and Development
- Provided foundation training for 15 staffs on good facilitation, occupational health and safety (OHS), Personal Protective Equipment using etc.

9. Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET):






PROJECT SUMMARIES OF 2022

I am Amina Khatun. I live with my husband and children in Patilapara village of Baraid union in Saturia upazila of Manikganj district. My daughter is read in class three. Our home is in a field quite far from the locality. Here we have 3 families in 2 houses. We had no source of safe water for drinking. We have little land where we cultivate vegetables and sell the market to make a living.

But due to lack of irrigation, vegetables would not be produced well. Due to lack of money we can't install a shallow tube-well.



Now SMKK has installed a shallow tube-well in our home premises funded by Penny Appeal. Now our water crisis is solved and we can irrigate the vegetable fields.



We are very much happy and pray to Allah for donor for supported us. We are really grateful to SMKK and Penny appeal. *Amina Khatun, Tube-well Usurer.*

River erosion-affected Alo Rani Rajbangshi is very happy to get Penny Appeal's tube-well.

I am Alo Rani Rajbongshi. I live with my one daughter in Patilapara village of



Baraid union in Saturia upazila of Manikganj district. Before we used to live on the banks of Dhaleshwari River. Five years ago, all our lands were finished by the river erosion. Since all the lands are lost due to river

erosion, we bear the expenses of the family by cultivating other people's lands on lease.



Currently the chairman has helped build a house but could not install any tubewell for drinking water due to lack of money.

Now we got a shallow tube-well from SMKK funded by Penny Appeal and the water has also been very good.



We now use this tube-well water for bathing, drinking and cooking and we are healthy from germs for received hygiene training. We are very much happy and grateful to Penny Appeal- *Alo Rani Rajbangshi*, *Tube-well user*.

Zahanara Khatun is happy to get Qurbani meat from SMKK

Zahanara Khatun is wife of Late Monohar Seikh. She is widow. She has four (4) members in his family including his son's wife and children. His son is an agricultural labourer and his income is very low. The family lives on the income of Jahanara Khatun's only son. She manages her family with great difficulty. and he is constantly struggling with poverty.



Problem:

Because of poverty, it is not possible for him to Qurbani or even buys meat on the day of Eid.

Response:

Muslim Charity provided 2 kg Qurbani meat to Zahanara Khatun through Sheba Manab Kallyan Kendra-SMKK for enjoy Eid with his family joyfully. By eating the meat of this Qurbani, all the members of Zahanara Khatun's family will meet the demand for nutrition.

I am Zahanara Khatun. My Husband's name is late Monohar Seikh. I live in Kanchanpur village of Sadar upazila of Kushtia district. I am a Widow. We are 4 family members. I am very happy to get 2 kg of Qurbani meat from Muslim Charity through SMKK. We cannot Qurbani for poverty and we didn't get Qurbani meat from anywhere else. We thanks to Muslim Charity for providing the Qurbani Meat. We pray to Allah for donor as well as Muslim Charity. We expect others help, including Qurbani meat, every year.


