BACKGROUND:

Sheba Manab Kallyan Kendra (SMKK) is a non-profit, non-political voluntary development organization, established in January 1996 and registered with the competent authority of the Government including NGO Affairs Bureau, Bangladesh. It's main office is based in Bagerhat district HQ. and a liaison office in the Dhaka and also operated its field offices strategically located in different areas of southwestern districts of Khulna and Barisal divisions. It has some other project offices under Gazipur, Bogra and Rangpur districts.

Since the commencement of the organization, it has been implementing integrated development projects/programmes with the poor and ultra poor of the community with particular focus to address the rights of children and women for bringing a positive change in their livelihood. Over time SMKK has gained experience and capacity by working on various development issues with technical and financial

support from multifarious donors including Winrock International /USAID, WFP, DFID, FAO, SDC, DANIDA, WorldFish Center, HOPE'87-Austria, Islamic Development Bank, Muslim Aid-UK, Bangladesh NGO Foundation, STROMME Foundation, MWA, BRAC, CODEC, NGO Forum DWSS, UNICEF, Islamic Relief, Bangladesh Bank, LGED, DAE, BWDB, CARE Bangladesh, UNDP, Winrock International India, SONNE International Austria, Pubali Bank Limited, The Art of Living Foundation & UNEP. Some of the projects were continued for long term duration. It has gained a significant institutional and managerial competency to implement larger initiatives is different sectors.

SMKK has a team of 129 regular staff members and have more than 81 temporary staff members who are well qualified and experienced to facilitate transfer of information and technology for wider adoption by its target beneficiaries, thus enabling them to attain improvement of livelihood standard. The organization has so far been reached to 193,525 beneficiaries through different development initiatives which are being implemented.

SMKK has experience in implementing income generation activities through off-farm and agro based technology transfer, including Agriculture, Fisheries, Forestry, Livestock, home based IGA operated by women. SMKK has been working for women empowerment through involving them in different income earning activities and linked with micro finance for startup capital. It has also long working experience in building institutional capacity development of the rural community people to address social issues through collective efforts. Participatory approaches are being followed to identify issues and action-oriented program implemented to address these issues that hindered the process of their development.

SMKK strongly trusts in target population concept for its basic development efforts in which the focus is the destitute and disadvantaged poor with emphasis on children and women. The organization follows regular monitoring, feedback, sharing experiences and immediate action for the successful implementation of the projects/programmes. It is dedicated to foster qualitative and quantitative improvement in the living standard of the target beneficiaries.

SMKK has a policy to work in that area where the people are comparatively more vulnerable. Its programmes specially targeted to ensure its support to establish rights of the women, adolescent girls and children to remove social injustice and bring a society free from discrimination. Bringing people together to work for their own.

OBJECTIVES OF THE ORGANIZATION:

The long term objectives of the organization include;

- To build awareness of the people about socioeconomic structure and their role in the development process.
- To encourage people to come under SMKK umbrella to overcome the existing situation and improve livelihood.
- To eradicate poverty by utilization of internal and external resources.
- To educate illiterate children and men & women
- To initiate institution building campaigns;
- Campaign anti-drug education and to aware about AIDS & STDs
- To improve health care facilities, MCH and FP services;
- To rehabilitate the affected victims of women & child trafficking & acid burns.
- To implement pilot projects for employment for the target beneficiaries.
- To afford access of the target beneficiaries to NGOs and govt. facilities. To carry canal digging for reserving water irrigation.



VISION:

The long term envision of SMKK is empowerment of its target beneficiaries through education, health services training and development approaches ensuring social and economical development for the disadvantages and destitute and remove sufferings of the resource poor people.

MISSION:

The mission of SMKK is guided in providing technical & financial supports enabling the target beneficiaries to involve themselves in various development programs to create income and employment opportunities for their sustainable development.



STRATEGIES:

Implicit in the programs strategy is a belief in the efficacy of strengthening the demand side of the services equation based on felt needs of the target beneficiaries. The strategy of the development and training programs included the following:

- To provide the target groups with different need based training for improving professional efficiency;
- To organize groups for the target male and female beneficiaries both in the urban and rural areas;
- To promote awareness through education, training and exchange of technical know how for sustainable development;
- To mobilize youths for playing effective role in socio-economic development activities leading to self – reliance;
- To create opportunity for exploring and mobilizing locally available resources;
- To undertake different government programs for raising awareness of the target beneficiaries emphasizing on employment, health, sanitation, food value, safe drinking water, MCH & FP, protection of environment and other programs for community development.
- To ensure women participation in the development activities and raising awareness for preventing child abuse; cruelty on women, strengthening sound gender relation, increasing income of women through various IGAs
- To afford access to the target beneficiaries to NGO and Government operated credit facilities for income generating activities
- To establish contacts with credit and other support services offered by the NGOs, Government agencies, international donors etc.

All management is conferred on Executive Committee, headed by the Chairman who is responsible for planning for the programs, organizing resources, making policies and implementation of the programs.

Some projects were exclusively targeted to rights, education, water, sanitation and health related activities. THE SPREAD OF SMKK OPERATION AREA:

Increasing demand and with the shift of appropriate approaches from charity to development, SMKK Increasing demand and with the shift of appropriate approaches from charity to development, SMKK programs have been expanded to 35 Upazilas under 15 Districts. Extremely hard-core and poor people have been brought under the coverage. About 10,565 new families have been additionally included in both technical and financial support on livelihood. Preference were given to include women and children and mostly from the natural shocks prone area.

The rapidly expanding series of development programs were targeted to draw the attention of beneficiaries for which a numbers of poor people are seeking support form SMKK.

SMKK INTERVENTIONS FOR SIDR & AILA RESPONSE DURING THE YEAR 2010

Bangladesh was struck by the devastating cyclone SIDR on 15th of November 2007 and AILA on 25th May 2009 which created a massive destruction in the communities that it ripped through. Bangladesh counted it losses in billions in terms of human lives, material and livelihood.

Dwelling house represents the most visible and tangible damages associated with SIDR & AILA. According to GOB sources, the total number of houses damaged was about 1.8 million out of which about 39% were reported as fully damaged and 61% partially damaged. Approximately 4.8 million people, most of them were from the poorest of the poor, are in need of immediate life and livelihood saving assistance.



More than 2.3 million acres of cropland were reportedly badly damaged, the main crop damaged being rice. According to GOB, approximately 530,000 livestock animals were killed, the large majority believed to be cattle (a loss of household assets as well as a loss in terms of milk production). Food production has declined due to salinity, tidal surge and also they lost their boats, fishing nets etc. or to the unavailability of labor which was diverted to other critical activities like housing repair and reconstruction.

According to GOB figures more than 8,700 educational institutions were damaged, large numbers of educational material, including books and furniture were smashed and the few schools that could not remain open that experienced big drop in attendance. As a consequence of the above, the livelihoods of the people were severely affected.

Immediately after the SIDR & AILA, SMKK carried out massive relief and rescue operations in the Sidr areas. With the financial assistance of national and international donors, the organization responded in relief and rehabilitation activities in most remote areas. SMKK has undertaken different projects which includes; House construction, shelter repairing, water and sanitation, rehabilitation of Fisheries and prawn culture, seed and fertilizer distribution among the small and marginal farmers, distribution of vegetable seeds, distribution of milking cows and disbursement of interest free credit for restarting of income generation activities. The SIDR & AILA response services of SMKK covered at least 38 upazilas of Bagerhat, Pirojpur, Khulna, Barisal, Bhola, Barguna, Jhalakati, Patuakhali & Shatkhira districts.

SMKK also undertook programme on disaster preparedness and awareness programme aiming to face the challenges during the natural calamities. The organization intended to bring about the changes in the area and create self initiated programmes involving the community as it is obvious that the country is under threat of different calamities due to global climate change.

TRAINING PROGRAMS:

During the year, SMKK organized different human and skill development training for the beneficiaries to increase their basic awareness, knowledge, behavior, attitude and entrepreneurship. Well designed training material (mostly visual) were used for the target recipients and practical sessions were organized for the skilled development training. SMKK hired some experienced trainer from other organization besides its own training personnel. Strong emphases were given to utilize the knowledge in their daily life to increase income. Regular mentoring and extension support and in some cases refresher training was organized for the beneficiaries.

INCOME AND EMPLOYMENT GENERATING PROGRAMS:

1. Increasing Rice Production, Quality Seed Preservation for HYV Aman and Cropping Pattern (BRRI dhan-44/33/32, wheat variety Satabdi, BARI mug -66):

Under the financial support of JBIC & BARC through Training & Technology Transfer (TTT), the project implemented in the name of Agricultural Technology Transfer Project. The project was started in July 2008 and continued till the end of December 2010.

The project activities were implemented at Amtali upazila of Barguna district and Kawkhali upazila of Pirojpur district and total budget was BDT 532,000.00

Objectives of the project:

The overall objective of the project was to popularize the high yielding variety crops and find out the suitability cropping pattern in the soil condition of coastal area. Including others, the specific objectives of the project were;

- o Transfer of improved Agricultural Technologies in the coastal areas
- Improve Yield per unit area
- Poverty reduction through farming of high value crops
- Introduction of high value crops for increasing agricultural production in coastal districts.
- Replace existing cropping pattern through induction of HYV crops and disseminated agricultural technologies.
- Increase farmer's skills and knowledge in using modern cultivation practices.

Activities Performed:

The project was implemented through participatory field based demonstrations in the farmer's field and tried to promote the technology in the community. Working closely with the local agriculture department, technical support and utilization of recommended inputs have given good result of the crops yield. Following activities were specifically performed to achieve the goal of the project.



- Established linkages with different actors of agriculture and maintain a close liaison with Upazila Agriculture Officer and his staff members assigned for project area for obtaining their cooperation and assistance for successful implementation of the project.
- Baseline survey for reference and selection of 75 farmers for each technology as per prescribed format given by ATTP-TTT
- Selection of potential resource poor farmers in the project through survey and individual contact.
- Group formation of resource poor farmers and training on selected agricultural technology.

- Organized training for 150 farmers for transferring selected agricultural technology (75 farmers for each technology for one year) where Upazila Agriculture Officer was the resource person besides our trained staff members
- Establishment of 75 demonstration plots of the selected agricultural technology at the farmers and continue field extension support.
- Organized field days for promotion of the agricultural technology and future replication in the area.

It was observed that the above technology is well accepted by the local farmers as per unit yield is much higher than that of traditional seed and technology used in the past. Quality seed preservation and scarcity of seeds is major problem for the farmers and through the project, the technology was transferred to the farmers that will have a long tern impact of the project.

2. Low Cost Housing Program for Poor Families:

Housing for the poor communities is a major concern as they have lack of resources to invest for the construction of house. Low cost housing program has been started by SMKK in the year of 2003 under the funding support of Bangladesh Bank (Grihayan Tahabil). This is long term project through which credit support are being provided to the poor families with less interest and flexible repayment facilities. Till end of December, 2010, a total of BDT 4,750,000.00 was disbursed.

The project is being implemented at the Nesarabad upazila of Perojpur and Betagi upazila of Barguna district and during the year 34 poor families have been included for the housing support.



Since the operation of the project, it reveals from the monitoring report that the utilization and repayment of the fund is highly satisfactory. Bangladesh Bank authority paid their support and expressed their satisfaction on the performance and given commitment for continuous support.

3. Micro Finance for Income Generation Activities and Rural Agricultural Credit Program

Reduction of vulnerability needs attention to generate self employment opportunity for the poor communities. It is beyond of imagination that without having the capital support, no one can start income generation activities. Dependency to the local money lender is usually have negative impact and in most cases the outcome is not encouraging. SMKK tried to generate a Revolving Micro Credit fund under the agreement with CODEC/STROMME Foundation and Pubali Bank Limited .

This program is running on pilot bases from the year of 2006 and successfully operating in 18 upazilas under Perojpur, Bagerhat and Barguna district. Some basic information of the activities as follows:

Objectives of the Project:

- To support the poor and disadvantaged families through start-up capital cost of income generation activities.
- To help in generation of income and employment opportunity for the poor families
- To improve livelihood standard of the poor community
- o To assist in increase opportunity of family based income

Activities Performed:

- o Identified the individual interested to operate self employed income generation activities.
- Assess the requirement of funding support and disbursed micro credit to 6,048 poor families.
- Provide market information and marketing linkage support to the beneficiaries.
- Established linkages with other micro financing institutions.

4. Interest Free Micro Finance for SIDR Victims:

SMKK also managing a interest free credit fund to support disaster victims in their restoration of business and other home based income generation activities. The fund is supported by CODEC & STROMME Foundation, NGO Forum, EC and MISEREOR.

The project started in January, 2008 and successfully continuing its operation in one upazila under Perojpur district.

- Working location: Nesarabad upazila under Perojpur district

Objectives of the Project:

The ultimate objective of the initiative was to provide financial support to the victims of SIDR and AILA victims who lost their assets and could not start their income earning activities and usually have no alternative source of managing fund. The specific objectives of the project are;

- Support Sidr victim small and marginal farmers for starting of income generation activities and employed business.
- Increase opportunity of family based income

Activities Performed:

- Disbursed interest free micro credit to 315 poor families affected during Sidr who have started their business with the credit support and earning their livelihood.
- Established linkages with other micro financing institutions

Compared to the cyclone victim and existing opportunity of employment in the affected area, the funding support is not enough to cover more families. SMKK tried to mobilize more resources but could not able to find the sources. However, this is a good starting of the activity and in future there is a plan to generate an emergency fund that can utilized by the organization as and when needed.

5. NGO and Civil Society Networking Project- NCSNP:

The program is not a large project but has played a significant role in increasing awareness of the common people on health and hygiene practices. It is commonly believed that the rural people are not taking care for the water born diseases and not used to wash their hand properly during cooking, before taking meal and after using of toilets. Due to their ignorance, they can not taking care of their children as well. The program aims to impart basic knowledge on changing behaviors and practices for the health care for both adult and children.



Under the financial assistance of NGO Forum-DWSS & DANIDA, the program implemented at Sadar upazila under Bagerhat district and utilized an amount of BDT 189,000.00

Objectives of the Project:

- To increase awareness of community people on health, hygiene
- To create awareness of the community people on child health the role of parents

Activities Performed:

- Organized training program for the community people, the number of participants were 5000 and among them 450 were parents. The issues were primary health care, hygiene and care taking of child's health
- Organized community campaign on the issues related to social awareness on their role for reducing diseases.
- Installed latrine in the schools in the project area.

Informal discussion sessions also arranged in those communities to review the training and sharing knowledge. It was also closely monitored about the practices and improvement of overall health and hygiene situation.

6. Cyclone Affected Aquaculture Rehabilitation Project (CAARP):

The project CAARP 1 was started immediately after the devastated cyclone SIDR to rehabilitate the prawn and fish farmers who incurred losses in their fish/prawn culture. The project was also extended for the second phases with inclusion of more farmers.

Through the project, a large number of poor and marginal farmers are being supported for agricultural activities. One of the important sectors of SMKK is education, particularly for the dropped out children. The schooling program was started in the year of 2006 under the financial support of BRAC and will be continued till 2012. The organization is trying to mobilizer more resources for operating more schools in other area. Some brief information of the Education support Program is given herewith.

The project will have no operational cost, e.g. feeding cost but after rearing of 6-9 months, the beneficiaries will have some income to support their family as well as this will help in increasing nutritional intake. Details of the project are as follows:

In rural areas, pre-schooling is not usually being practiced because of ignorance and facilities. SMKK tried to create an impact in the community that the parents should convince for sending their children in the non-formal school which will lead the young learners for their formal education.
